50 YEARS 1973 - 2023

The 1st Llanfair & District Show was held in 1891, in 1939 it was discontinued due to the 2nd World War. A Horticultural and Arts & Crafts show was revived by the Recreation Association in 1962 as an annual event held at the Public Institute until 1972.

On 30th Appril 1973 a public meeting was called by the late Robert Jones, Pentre to seek support to revive the Llanfair Caereinion and District Agricultural & Horticultural Society, as it is known today. This gained unanimous support and the first show was held on Mount Field on Saturday 8th September 1973.

The Show's success and its likely growth was discussed at length at the AGM resulting in a move to Pentre Fields from 1974 to 1994. The weather had been kind except for a storm in 1984 when members and officials were busy from 4am salvaging the event.

The Sheep Dog Trials were added in 1986 and Sheep Shearing competition in 1987, which has now been replaced in recent years by the excitement of Speed Shearing.

A larger venue was needed in 1995 and the show moved to Mathrafal in the Meifod valley where in 1997 we celebrated the 25th Show since its revival.

Unfortunately in 2001 the area was deeply affected by the outbreak of Foot and Mouth and due to restrictions no show was held that year.

In 2005 the committee were approached for the use of the main marquee following the show for a Charity Sunday Lunch. This has become an annual event since then and has over the years raised enormous amount of money for various charities.

In 2010 due to change in farming policies at Mathrafal a new venue had to be found. The show committee were very grateful to the Tudor family for making their fields at Llysun, Llanerfyl available, where the show has continued to thrive.

The show was interrupted again in 2020 and 2021 due to the Covid Pandemic when all public events were affected causing no show to be held for two years.

Finally in 2022 we were able to continue with our Annual Show, although without the cattle section due to ongoing TB restrictions. Following a two year break the show was very well supported and a great success.

This has now brought us to 2023 where we celebrate 50 years from when the show was revived back in 1973.

50 O FLYNYDDOEDD 1973 - 2023

Cynhaliwyd Sioe gyntaf Llanfair a'r Cylch nol yn 1891ac yna hyd 1939 cafodd ei ohirio oherwydd yr Ail Ryfel Byd. Ail ddechreuwydd yr adran Garddwriaeth a Celf a Chrefft yn 1962 a cafodd ei gynnal yn flynyddol yn yr Institiwt hyd 1972.

A'r 30ain o Ebrill 1973 galwyd cyfarfod cyhoeddus gan y diweddar Robert Jones, Pentre i weld os oedd cefnogaeth mewn ail-sefydlu Cymdeithas Amaethyddol a Garddwriaeth Llanfair Caereinion a'r Cylch, fel ei gelwir hyd heddiw. Roedd y gefnogaeth yn unfrydol a chynhaliwyd y Sioe gyntaf ar Gae Mownt ar ddydd Sadwrn, 3ydd o Fedi 1973.

Gyda llwyddiant y Sioe a rhagolygon y byddai yn tyfu fe symudwyd i gaeau Pentre yn 1974 lle y bu hyd 1994.

Fe ddaeth Treialon Cwn Defaid yn rhan o'r Sioe yn 1986 a chystadleuaeth Cneifio in 1987, sydd nawr wedi newid i'r gystadleuaeth cyffrous Cneifio Cyflym.

Symudwyd y sioe i faes Mathrafal yn 1995 ac yn 1997 fe ddathlwyd 25 o flynyddoedd ers ei ail-sefydlu.

Yn anfoddus yn 2001 fe gafodd y clwy Traed a'r Genau effaith enfawr ar yr ardal a bu rhaid gohirio y Sioe.

Yn 2005 cysylltwyd a'r pwyllgor i holi a oedd modd defnyddio y babell fawr i gynnal Cinio Sul Elusenol, ac erbyn hyn mae wedi bod yn ddigwyddiad blynyddol gan godi llawer o arian i bob math o elusenau dros y blynyddoedd.

Gyda newidiadau polisi ffermio ym Mathrafal yn 2010 bu rhaid edrych am safle newydd ac roedd pwyllgor y sioe yn ddiolchgar iawn i deulu Tudor am rhoi caniatad i ddefnyddio caeau Llysun, Llanerfyl, ble mae'r sioe wedi barhau i dyfu.

Yn 2020 a 2021 bu rhaid gohirio y sioe oherwydd pandemig Covid a gafodd gymaint o effaith ar bob digwyddiad cyhoeddus. Ond o'r diwedd yn 2022 roeddem yn gallu cynnal sioe eto, ond heb adran y gwartheg oherwydd cyfyngiadau TB. Er na fu sioe am ddwy flynedd cafwyd sioe llwyddiannus iawn.

Ac nawr yn Sioe 2023 byddwn yn dathlu 50 mlynedd ers i'r sioe gael ei ail-sefydlu nol yn 1973.

RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY/ RHEOLAU AC AMODAU O'R GYMDEITHAS

That the Society shall be called "Llanfair Caereinion and District Agricultural and Horticultural Society". Local Classes competitions shall be for persons residing within a 8 mile radius as shown on the map on page 6, with the Open Classes as shown in the schedule are open to competitors from any distance.

That every subscriber of £8.00 and upwards annually, £5.00 (15 years and under) shall be a Member of the Society, and that subscriptions shall be considered due on the 1st April of each year.

All stock exhibited (except ring events) must have been in the possession of the Exhibitor for at least 2 months prior to Show Day. All exhibits in the Agricultural Produce Class must be the Bona Fide property of the Exhibitor, grown, produced or manufactured on their particular holding.

Exhibitors shall be responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage including liability occasioned by or arising from any animal including dogs and horses, poultry or item entered for competition or display.

Should the right of any part to a prize be disputed, notice of the same must be given to the Secretary, in writing, on the day of the Show before 6.00pm. This refers to all classes.

Any person lodging a protest must deposit, at the same time the sum of £5.00, which shall be forfeited to the Society (at the discretion of the Committee) if the protest is not sustained.

All parties exhibiting at this Societyís Show must be governed by the Rules and Regulation as interpreted by the Secretary.

All stock must be on the Show Ground by 9.30am promptly unless otherwise stated in the Schedule. Judging will commence at 10.00am except the Horse Section and main marquee which will commence as stated.

Payment of prizes will be made on production of Prize Cards to the Treasurer. Prize money must be claimed on day of the Show.

The Silver Cups are perpetual unless otherwise stated and must be returned to the Show Secretaries or Section Secretary by the 1st of August following that in which the cup was won.

Entries close on Saturday, 26th August. Entries should be posted to the relevant Section Secretary or via the entry form on our Website or handed in at The Institute, Llanfair Caereinion on Saturday, 26th August between 10.00am and 12 noon.

Donors of Cups and Prizes shall become Members of the Society for the year in which the Cup was donated. Donors of Cups and Trophies are respectfully asked to have them engraved before handing over to the Society, in time for Show Day.

Perpetual Cups will remain the property of the Society, unless otherwise stated.



8oz SR Flour 6oz sultanas 6oz clear honey 2 medium eggs 4oz butter or margarine pinch of salt

Line 7" round cake tin. Heat oven to 180C/Gas4/160 Fan. Cream butter and honey together. Beat the eggs well and add alternately with the sifted flour and salt. Save a little to add with the sultanas. A little milk may be added if necessary, fold in the sultanas and stir well. Pour mixture in tin and bake for approximately 1hr 15mins.

(LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE - CLASS 5

4oz soft margarine 607 SR Flour 1 teaspn baking powder 6oz caster sugar 2 eggs beaten 4 tablespoons milk

Grated rind of 1 lemon

Topping

luice of lemon 2oz caster sugar

Combine all ingredients for the cake and mix well. Turn into a 2lb loaf tin, which should be lined with non-stick baking parchment.

Level the surface and bake in the oven at 180C, Gas mark 4 for approx 40-50mins or until cake springs back from the sides. Warm the sugar and the lemon juice together, pour over cooled cake.

(CHOCOLATE FUDGE BROWNIES - CLASS 10)

55g cocoa powder ½ tsp vanilla essence 50ml boiling water 100g plain flour 85g unsalted butter or margarine melted ¼ tsp baking powder 100g plain chocolate chunks

225g caster sugar

1egg

Pre-heat oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4. Grease a 20cm/8inch square tin. Mix together the cocoa, boiling water and half the melted butter and stir well. Add the sugar, egg, vanilla essence and remaining butter, then sieve in the plain flour and baking powder and mix well. Stir in the chocolate chunks. the mixture will be fudge-like and shiny. Spread it into the tin and bake for 25-30mins. The top should be firm and the cake set. Cut into squares with a sharp knife whilst still warm and leave to cool in the tin.

CARAMEL CRUNCH SPECULOUS TRAYBAKE - CLASS 12

100g butter 600g Speculous biscuits

1 x 300g can condensed milk 200g white chocolate broken into pieces

Line a 20cm x 30cm tin (8x12inch) with baking paper. Put butter and condensed milk in a large pan over a low heat and warm until melted, then remove from heat. Crush the biscuits with a rolling pin or in a food processor. Add the crushed biscuits to the pan with the butter and milk and stir well, then place in the prepared tin. Use a wooden spoon to press down to an even layer. Then place in a fridge for an hour to set. When the mixture is almost set melt the chocolate over a bowl of boiled water or in a microwave in 20 second increments.

Pour the melted chocolate over the base and spread with a knife to form an even layer, then return to the fridge until set (2-3hours).

When set remove from the tin by lifting up the baking paper. Cut into 12 equal pieces (or more if you prefer)

PIMMS JELLY - CLASS 23

1 sachet powdered gelatine Juice 1 lemon 1 large orange 150ml Pimms 1 eating apple 450ml lemonade Lemon & cucumber slices & mint sprigs to decorate

Pour 4 tablespoons boiling water into a bowl and sprinkle in the gelatine. Stir until dissolved then set aside. Slice off top and bottom of the orange. Using a small sharp knife slice off the skin taking away as much pith as possible. Holding the orange over a bowl, slice in between each segment to release the flesh and juice into the bowl. Core and finely chop the apple and toss in lemon juice to

release the flesh and juice into the bowl. Core and finely chop the apple and toss in lemon juice to prevent browning. Mix into the orange segments. Divide between four serving glasses or tumblers. Mix the Pimms with the gelatine and lemonade and pour over the fruit. Chill for 1-2 hours until set. Serve decorated with slices of lemon, cucumber and sprigs of mint.

STRAWBERRY MILKSHAKE CUPCAKES - CLASS 27

Cupcakes Buttercream

125g margarine 125g softened butter 125g Strawberry Milkshake Powder 125g icing sugar

125g SR Flour 75g Strawberry Milkshake Powder

2 large eggs 200g soft cream cheese

Pre-heat oven to 190C/Gas 4 and line bun tin with paper cases. Place all the cupcake ingredients into a large bowl and beat until well combined and smooth. Spoon the mixture evenly into the paper cases and bake for 20-25mins until golden and springy to touch.

Allow to cool. Make the buttercream by beating softened butter the adding the icing sugar and milkshake powder. Mix together until well combined and smooth. Drain any liquid off cream cheese and add to buttercream. Beat well for a couple of minutes until light, fluffy and thickened. Put butter icing into a piping bag and pipe swirls on top of each cake. Decorate as desired.


